However, before that we welcome back this month on 1st October a very popular speaker. Mike Abel is returning to give a timely talk as we are all being encouraged to grow our own produce on "Growing Vegetables". Apart from Mike being a keen gardener he is also a beekeeper and will be coming back to the Club in 2025 to talk on this very subject on November 4^{th.} However, there will be an earlier opportunity to purchase and enjoy the delicious honey his bees produce this month!



Now let's turn to jobs to do in the garden and allotment this month –

1.Bring tender plants indoors before the first frost.

2. Plant out perennials.

3. Plant spring bulbs such as daffodils, bluebells and tulips.

4. Lift dahlia tubers after the first frost or cover with deep mulch.

5. Mulch around borderline hardy plants.

6. Rake up Autumn leaves and add them to the compost bin

7. Move any exotic plants back into the greenhouse before nights get too chilly.

8. Cover bare soil with organic mulch both in the garden and allotment

9. Harvest pumpkins to store well before any sign of frost.

10. Plant out onion sets and garlic.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH HONEY CAKE Pre-heat oven to 1800 Gas Mark 4 and line a greased, floured square tin Serves 10

INGREDIENTS

1 egg 1/2 cup of sugar 150g honey cinnamon to taste cloves to taste 11/2 tsp bicarbonate of soda 2 cups sifted flour 50g blanched almonds (optional)

METHOD

Beat the eggs and sugar together. Add the honey, spices and bicarbonate of sugar. Gradually stir in the flour. Pour into the prepared cake tin and bake for approximately 15-20 minutes. Remove from the oven when cooked and place on a wired rack. When cooled the cake can be cut in half and filled with jam. **ENJOY!**
