EXHIBITORS FEES 25p per entry

ON SHOW DAY

- Check that your Entry card(s) correctly describe the Classes you intend to enter
- Ensure each exhibit is placed in the correct area designated for that Class
- 3. Give yourself ample time to set up multiple exhibits

NB Exhibitors must vacate the hall by 10am when judging will commence

8pm on the Wednesday prior to the Show. LATE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE

ACCEPTED.

SHOW EXHIBITS

In Divisions A-E exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor for at least 2 months prior to the show date.

All exhibits must comply with size, dimension & number of items as stipulated in the Schedule.

Staging of exhibits can only take place during the times stated in the Schedule (See Show Programme on page 6) No exhibits are to be removed from the Show until the Awards Ceremony has finished.

SHOW EXHIBITORS

Any attempts to deceive the Judges will result in the forfeiting of any prizes.

Only one exhibit per exhibitor may be entered in any one Class.

Only one entry allowed in the same Class from crops / subjects

that have been jointly raised on a shared plot.

Individuals who raise their own crops / subjects on a shared plot may each enter in any one Class.

All Exhibits must be staged and the Hall vacated by 10am sharp on the Saturday morning of the Show.

THE CONDUCT OF SHOW OFFICIALS AND JUDGES

Show Officials, whilst taking all reasonable care of exhibits, shall not be responsible for any damage that may occur.

Judges reserve the right to withhold prizes in any Class where entries are insufficient or not of adequate quality.

While Judging is in progress no persons other than Show Officials and Stewards are permitted in the Hall.

The decisions made by the Judges are final.

- 1. Root vegetables should be washed but not scrubbed
- 2. To dress onions: Do not overskin. Trim roots at basal plate
- 3. Cut & bend over neck and tie with raffia or natural string.
- 4. Exhibits should be clean & undamaged by weather, pest or disease
- A good proportion of flowers should be open

HINTS & TIPS FOR VEGETABLE SHOWING

- 1. Vegetables should be washed not scrubbed.
- To dress onions: Do not overskin. Trim roots at basal point and bend over neck and tie with raffia or natural string
- 3. Potatoes: Varieties with coloured 'eyes' should be in Class B16 unless a salad variety
- 4. Exhibits should be the same variety within each class of near equal size and arranged attractively on a plate or on the table
- 5. Marrows/squashes should be max size 35cms long or 16cms diameter if round

- 2. Stalks should remain attached
- Where "any number" is stated, there should be enough to make a pleasing display, according to size

RECIPE : CLASS JOI

SCHOOL CAKE

Using equal weights for eggs, flour, sugar and margarine means it is very hard to get it wrong! The recipe is based on the weight of eggs in their shells, meaning whether you use large or medium eggs you are pretty well guaranteed to produce a delicious soft sponge tray-bake. Line and grease an 8"x8" square cake tin and preheat oven to 180c.

INGREDIENTS

sugar threads)

Self-raising flour
Margarine
Caster sugar
3 large eggs
2tps vanilla extract
2tbs milk
Icing sugar
Sprinkles (hundreds and thousands/

METHOD FOR SPONGE

Weigh the eggs (in their shells) and use the same weight for your flour, sugar and margarine. In a medium mixing bowl combine the margarine, sugar and vanilla and beat with a spoon or use an electric whisk/beaters until soft, fluffy and light. Add one egg and stir. Add a third of the flour to the mixture and stir. Repeat with the rest of the eggs and the rest of the flour. Add the milk and stir. Spoon the sponge batter into the prepared tin and bake until golden and a skewer inserted into the middle of the sponge comes out clean. Then remove from the oven and transfer to a rack to cool. Once cooled make the water icing.

METHOD FOR WATER ICING

Sift the icing sugar into a bowl then add water a drop at a time until you get a thick icing. Spoon the icing over the cake and scatter the sprinkles over the cake whilst still wet.
